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Measuring your space



UNDERSTANDING YOUR SPACE

Your existing space will play a huge role in the plan that we develop. For this reason, we ask that new clients measure their space using the tools and guidelines below. If you're not comfortable measuring your space, a Kitchen & Bath Gallery representative will be happy to help... just ask!

What you'll need:

- Tape Measure
- Pencil
- Floor plan grid (next page)

The steps to measuring your room

- 1. Start in a corner and measure, in inches, the distance to every item on that wall from the corner
- 2. Do the same from every corner, marking down all measurements on your sketch
- 3. Make sure to include the measurements from outlets, light switches, ledges and / or soffits
- 4. Include window and door casing widths
- 5. Note the height of windows and outlets from the floor
- 6. Be sure to measure the ceiling height
- 7. Feel free to take photos while measuring these can help us to visualize the project more readily

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
